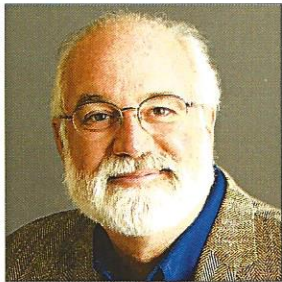

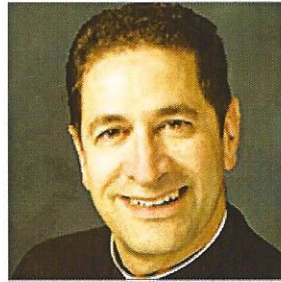

In the wake of the 1992 Los Angeles riots, he and his community launched their first social enterprise business, Homeboy Bakery. Today, Homeboy Industries employs and trains former gang members in a range of social enterprises, as well as provides critical services to over 10,000 men and women who walk through its doors every year seeking a better life.



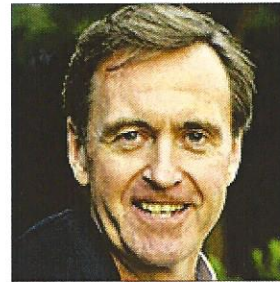
REV. TIMOTHY P. KESICKI, SJ

Fr. Timothy P. Kesicki, SJ, is the President of the Jesuit Conference of Canada and the United States. Headquartered in Washington, D.C., the Jesuit Conference promotes common goals and oversees international projects for the Society of Jesus. As Conference President, Fr. Kesicki works with the Jesuit Provincials of the United States and Canada and has been a contributor for CNN and MSNBC for discussion on Pope Francis and The Vatican.



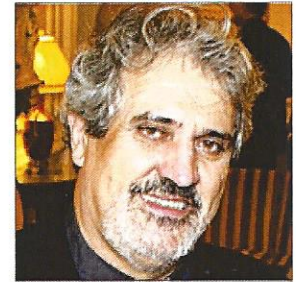
KATHERINE MARSHALL

Katherine Marshall is a senior fellow at Georgetown University's Berkley Center for Religion, Peace, and World Affairs, where she leads the Center's program on Religion and Global Development, and is Professor of the Practice of Development, Conflict, and Religion. She helped to create and now serves as the executive director of the World Faiths Development Dialogue.



CHRISTOPHER LOWNEY

Chris Lowney chairs the board of Catholic Health Initiatives, one of the nation's largest healthcare/hospital systems with some \$19 billion in assets. He is a popular keynote speaker who has lectured in more than two dozen countries on leadership, business ethics, decision-making and other topics. He is the author of four books. Heroic Leadership, a #1 ranked bestseller, has been translated into eleven languages.



REV. PETER BALLEIS, SJ

Rev. Peter Balleis, SJ, is the director of Jesuit Worldwide Learning – Higher Education at the Margins (JWL), a collaborative global initiative that provides certificate and diploma programs to those who live in refugee camps and in places where higher learning is out of reach. Originally from Bavaria, Germany, Fr. Balleis joined the Jesuits in 1981, and later began working at Jesuit Refugee Service, where he served as international director for eight years.
